

The **PharmacoNeuroImmunology (PNI) program** is now accepting applications from **post-doctoral fellows** seeking laboratory-based neuroimmune/neurobehavior in addiction research training in an NIH/NIDA funded training program.

The PNI is specifically looking for a recent doctoral degree recipient (within the past 4 years) in areas that intersect four disciplines: Pharmacology, Psychology/Psychiatry, Neuroscience, and Microbiology/Immunology.

Our faculty mentors are a talented group of neuroscientist, psychologists, pharmacologists, immunologists at the University of Minnesota. Across these disciplines we have both laboratory-based scientists and clinical faculty, allowing the program to attract outstanding trainees. The well-funded mentors have extensive experience as mentors and are committed to training fellows in this interdisciplinary setting.

Since this program is a federally funded program, only U.S. citizens and those foreign nationals who possess a permanent residency visa (green card) may be supported.
